
School Lunches

School Lunches for this half term are £95.00 (38 x 2.50). Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to a universal free school meal every day. Once pupils move into Years 3-6, then they need to pay for lunches unless they are entitled to an income-related free school meal. To find out if you are eligible to claim, please call 0300 123 5012 and you will get an instant response.

Please note that children should not bring in sweets or confectionery for their snack or in their lunch box. We are also a nut free site and have children on roll who would have a very serious allergic reaction to nuts, should they be exposed to them.
