In an effort to be healthier it was agreed that the Money Tree envelopes will not include sweets – money / small gifts only	
The tattoo and hair stand will not use glitter (due to its effect on climate) and will use face paint instead. CK to investigate face paint kit (with Christmas stencils) and hair spray.	СК
