

### **First Lego League**

On Wednesday, this year's Lego team participated in a regional round of the First Lego League, and for the fourth year running, won one of the four key awards.

Each team has to perform in robot design, a robot game, an innovation research project and 5-minute presentation, and is judged throughout the day on their 'core values.' These are the qualities which are at the heart of our ethos in St Anne's Fulshaw; teamwork, kindness, respect, resilience, enthusiasm, hard work and friendly competition.

The children have worked **really** hard after school every week since half term.

The team performed magnificently in their presentation, which was linked to our eco bricks project, and inspired one of the judges to make eco bricks at home. Their robot performed well, and they spoke effectively about the problems they had encountered in the design, build and test process.

I was very pleased for them when they were awarded the prize for Core Values, ahead of 23 other schools (mostly secondary level) from the Midlands. The trophy will join our collection in the entrance hall, and if you get chance, I am sure the children would appreciate a handshake!

### **Residential Trips**
