
As we draw to the end of a very busy term I have enjoyed reflecting yet again on how much we have accomplished in the last twelve weeks...and how much is yet to come next term!

The cost of school lunches for next half term is £55.20 (23 x £2.40).

Please remember to give the school at least one week's notice if your child decides to change from packed lunches onto school

Lunches and snacks should not contain crisps, chocolate or sweets. Healthy snacks are available from our cook Janis at a cost of 20p per day. Please also ensure that your child has a water bottle in school every day. Water is available to the children all day and we encourage them to drink when they need to.

Just a few uniform reminders as we head into the summer months:

- School shoes should be black, no trainers or open toe sandals please (these have a habit of tripping pupils as they are running around at playtimes, and of course don't protect their toes while they are climbing or playing)
- Girls' socks should be white and boys' socks should be grey
- Girls may wear checked or striped green and white school dresses in the summer months and boys may wear grey shorts
- Only stud earrings should be worn and these should be removed or covered for PE
- Girls with long hair should have it tied up every day with a plain bobble, this really helps to halt the spread of head lice. Please do not wear ornate flowery clips and hairbands
- All uniform should be named. Unnamed lost property will be disposed of termly or sold as second hand uniform
- All children should have the correct PE kit in school. Children will not be permitted to borrow or share kit for hygiene reasons and will miss both their PE lesson and a playtime if they do not have the correct clothing in school
- Nail varnish or make up is not permitted

Positive Working Relationships

At St Anne's Fulshaw we are very proud of the way we work in close collaboration with parents to ensure the best outcomes for all pupils. As parents and educators we are passionate that all our children do as well as they possibly can. However this term there have been a number of incidents where staff have been spoken to in a hostile and aggressive way and even, on occasion, been shouted at and spoken to abusively by parents. Despite this involving a small number of parents, I would like to state very clearly that this behaviour is not welcome at our school under any circumstances. We expect all communication between parents and staff to be respectful, polite and of direct benefit to our pupils.

Any visitors to school who behave in an aggressive way towards staff will be given the chance to calm down and apologise, and if this is not possible then they will be asked to leave the premises immediately. Incidents will be reported to governors and the police if staff feel threatened. Governors have a duty of care to ensure that all school staff are able to work in a calm and safe environment without fear of abuse, and to protect pupils from witnessing unacceptable behaviour. If governors feel that these expectations have been breached then they may then take the decision to ban parents from the premises for a fixed period or indefinitely.
